How your child's speech is developing?

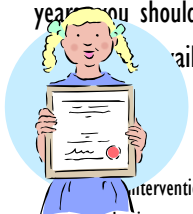
How your child is learning?

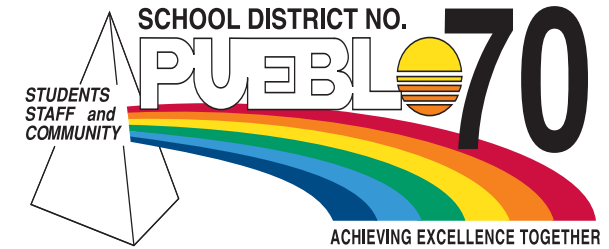

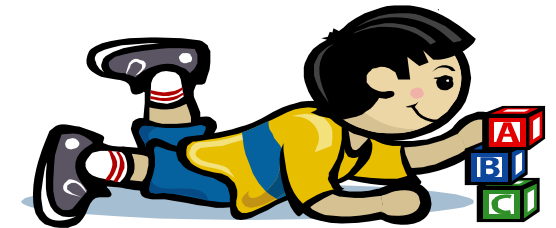

SERVICES

Screening: developmental screening in all areas; speech/language, fine motor skills, gross motor coordination, learning, hearing/vision, and social adaptability.

Assessment: comprehensive evaluations for children who may be in need of early childhood services, including special education programs.

Consultation: information provided to parents about child development, behavior management, and community resources.

Community Referrals: information and referrals to community resources which provide a variety of services.
